



Student Satisfaction Survey 2021-22

- 1. **Objectives:** To assess the level of satisfaction of the students about Teaching Learning Process, ICT tools and techniques, Infrastructure, Co-Curricular and Extra Curricular activities.
- 2. **Number of respondents:** 1,226 (Approximately 30% students)
- 3. **Dates:** 02/05/2022 16/05/2022
- 4. Methodology: Survey questionnaire Google Form was shared online with students of all the streams, selected randomly. The form contained multiple choice questions about curriculum, teaching-learning, evaluation, co-curricular activities and infrastructure. The last question was open ended inviting suggestions from students.
- 5. Out of 1226 students, 1085 students are from bachelor's degree, 132 students are from master's degree, 06 students are from UG diploma, 02 students are from PG diploma and 1 from Ph.D.






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96% students were positive about recommending this college to others.

85% students rated the college as Good or Excellent.



While analyzing the negative responses, we came across suggestions by the respondents. Some representative Suggestions by the respondents:

- The benches should be more comfortable as it's very uncomfortable to sit almost 1 hour continuously as it causes back pain and neck pain the college should be take note on this issue.
- The air conditioning should be well maintained in summer because in exam hall the AC was not cooling and very disappointing.
- ➤ Learning should be more practical and research based. Newer technologies must be used for learning instead of old ones. (Turbo C).
- > The lessons and poems of Hindi subject is very old and hence it includes all the traditional stereotypes. I do not prefer to allow young mind like us to study about such old customs and beliefs. Instead it should include more and more of millennial writer's works.
- New PCs are required in the laboratories.
- > Internal exam schedules should be declared well in advance.

The suggestions are forwarded to the Head of the Institution for appropriate action.


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

1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?


2. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching?






3. How would you rate your classroom teaching-learning experience in stimulating your interest in the subject/s?


