AUTONOMY: A NEW CHAPTER FOR SIES

Self-sufficiency and academic excellence are what the South Indian Education Society has always striven for. Our institution has joined an illustrious league of 12 autonomous colleges affiliated to the University of Mumbai after receiving the nod from the University Grants Commission (UGC) on **May 28, 2018**. The formal ceremony was presided over by Mr. Vidyasagar Rao, the Hon. Governor of Maharashtra and Chancellor of Mumbai University along with Dr. Suhas Pednekar, the Vice Chancellor, the Principal, Dr. Uma Shankar, was presented with the certificate granting Autonomy to the college. The Governor also inaugurated the new infrastructural developments in the college campus. The renovated library has been renamed as the Principal S. Ramanathan library and the Chemistry lab was also inaugurated formally. We hope that the air conditioned and digitalized library with the latest storage facilities (KOMPRESS) will increase the footfall in the library.



WHAT'S IN AUTONOMY FOR STUDENTS?

In the words of the Principal, Dr. Uma Shankar, "Examinations can be planned well, and timely results can be ensured. We will also utilize the new status to improve the brand value of the institution." A commendable academic reputation, exceptional performance in University examinations, along with co-curricular activities of the students are some of the factors that helped the college bag its autonomy. Stellar achievements of the faculty members and quality institutional management were some of the other reasons that have contributed towards the certification. 
Report:

ARE INDIANS READY FOR THE VACCINETS?

The world's long battle with COVID-19 is hitting its peak as countries begin to roll out vaccination drives. Millions of people are being vaccinated every day. Despite the challenge of having to vaccinate 1.3 billion people, India is making history with massive immunisation programs. Covaxin, the vaccine produced by the Hyderabad-based Bharat Biotech, has been found to be 81% effective in preventing COVID-19 and its variants. The other vaccine approved by the World Health Organization, marketed as Covishield and produced by Pfizer and Serum Institute of India. The national vaccination drive kicked off on January 16th, and as of 20th March, a total of 4,20,88,792 vaccine doses have been administered. The vaccination is being done in order of priority with healthcare workers being inoculated first, followed by those above the age of 60 as well as those above 45 with comorbidities began receiving their vaccine from March 1st.

India is now the world's largest manufacturer of the COVID-19 vaccine, with 5000 vaccines being produced per minute in the Serum Institute. The country is planning to export 10 million doses to 60 other countries. Meanwhile, India and South Africa are appealing to the World Health Organization to temporarily waive COVID-19 patents for vaccines and equipment. India is now being called the 'Pharmacy of the World' for the major role it is playing in fighting the pandemic, thanks to all the pharmaceutical companies for producing the vaccines, and the brave healthcare workers administering them.

PUBLIC SPEAK

The Covid-19 vaccination drive is going at a full pace. However, few people are scared about the same concerning its safety. Vaccination contains only killed or weakened germs like viruses or bacteria. They do not help you at risk of any complications. It is usually injected through a syringe but can also be given orally as capsules into the nose. It is one of the simplest, safe and effective ways to protect human health against harmful diseases. It will help to use your body's natural defence to create resistance to specific infections and help to keep the immune system stronger by creating antibodies. Everyone should unite and fight against this pandemic, which has created huge financial and life loss across the world.

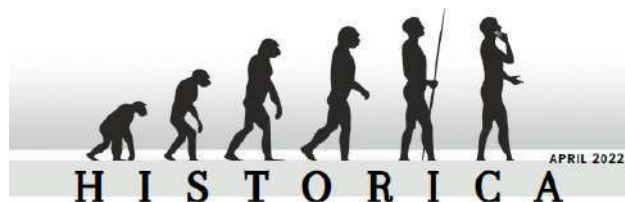

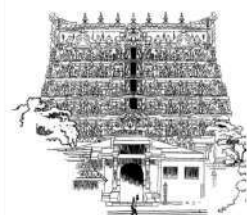
WHAT IS 2022 HISTORICA ABOUT ?


UDAAN – Teaching Event







Venue: Dadar Railway Station





Title of Workshop: "Anybody Can Sing"

Background: The "Anybody can Sing" workshop was organized by the Cultural Association at SIES College of Arts, Science, and Commerce. The workshop spanned across eight days, from 26th August to 8th September 2022, with each session lasting three hours. The workshop took place in the college's mini auditorium, and on the first day, Mr. Haroon Sir, the instructor, began with a brief introduction. He emphasized that everyone can be a singer with consistent practice and dedication. Over the course of the workshop, participants learned various aspects of vocal improvement. Participants were also introduced to various apps they could use for producing songs on their own. The final day of the workshop was marked by solo performances from each participant, who invited their friends to watch as "performers." The workshop witnessed a remarkable attendance of approximately 85% or more on all eight days.
