Academic Institutions

1. SIES High School

The SIES High School was established in 1932. It is a co-educational English medium school, reputed for its high academic service, discipline and efficient management. The school is recognized by the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai for primary education and Government of Maharashtra for secondary education (and follows the S.S.C syllabus). The institution caters to the educational needs of all students irrespective of caste, creed or religion right from Kinder Garten to Secondary School.

2. SIES (Dr. APJ. Abdul Kalam Memorial) High School, Ghatkopar

The North Mumbai Welfare Society (NMWS) was amalgamated with The South Indian Education Society in 2017 and pursuant to that merger, the Kinder Garten, Primary and Secondary Schools came under SIES administration and management. Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam was the Principal Patron of SIES and received its Lifetime Achievement Award. In his honour and memory and in acknowledgement of the significant contribution he made to ignite young minds, NMWS High School was named SIES (Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam Memorial) High School. The school is recognized by the Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai for primary education and Government of Maharashtra for secondary education (and follows the S.S.C syllabus).

3. SIES College of Arts, Science & Commerce [Empowered Autonomous], Sion West}

The SIES College of Arts, Science and Commerce [Empowered Autonomous] was established in 1960 to serve the ever-growing educational needs of the students from the North and Central Mumbai suburbs. The College was a gift to the then newly born State of Maharashtra. The Commerce Stream at the Degree level was started in 1980-81. 5. SIES (Nerul) College of Arts, Science & Commerce (Autonomous), Nerul

The SIES (Nerul) College Of Arts, Science & Commerce [Autonomous] was established in 1998. The College provides a safe academic environment and merit-based education. SIES Graduate School of Technology [Autonomous] was established in 2002. It offers four-year Bachelor of Engineering courses in Electronics and Telecommunication Engineering, Electronics & Computer Science, Computer Engineering, Artificial Intelligence & Data Science, Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning, Information Technology, Printing & Packaging Technology, Mechanical Engineering, Computer Science and Engineering (Internet of Things And Cyber Security Including Block Chain Technology). It has a collaboration with Osaka Metropolitan University, Japan under which several high-end technology programmes will be brought into the country. The course content will be aligned with the various investments made by the Japanese Government in India so that the Graduates can be absorbed in these projects. The courses are approved by AICTE. The College is affiliated to the University of Mumbai. It is accredited by NACC and NBA.

8. SIES Institute of Comprehensive Education

The SIES Institute of Comprehensive Education was established in June 1980, to meet the increasing demand for trained pre-primary teachers. With the mushrooming of nursery schools and with the dearth of adequate training programmes to train the personnel to mould the tiny tots, it was necessary to start an institute of early childhood education. From a mere training centre, the institute has established itself as a leading institution for Pre-Primary and Early Childhood Education in Mumbai and Navi Mumbai .

The institute is being upgraded into a College of Comprehensive Education post the approval for SIES University. Details for the proposed college are given separately.

9. SIES College of Management Studies (SIESCOMS), Nerul

The SIES College of Management Studies was established in 1986. It offers the Master's In Management Science (MMS) [Degree] and Master of Computer Application (MCA) affiliated to the University of Mumbai. Both are two year post graduate programmes. The various autonomous courses that were offered by the College of Management Studies were shifted to the SIES School of Business Studies after AICTE had directed that all non-affiliated programmes should be run under a separate academic organisation. It is accredited by Accreditation Council for Business Schools & Programs (ACBSP). It is also accredited by NAAC and NBA. These are full time programmes approved by AICTE.

10. SIES School of Business Studies (SIES SBS), Nerul

This management education institution, established in 2020 , offers Post Graduate Diploma in Business Administration (PGDBA), Post Graduate Diploma in Pharmaceutical Management (PGDM), Post Graduate Diploma in Bio-Technology Management (PGDBM). It also runs the Executive MBA Programmes of Indian Management Association. All these are full-time two-year programmes approved by AICTE.

11. SIES Indian Institute of Environment Management, Nerul

SIES-IIEM, established in 1999, dedicates itself to the service of mankind by providing innovative and effective solutions to environmental and natural resource problems. It strives to enable individuals and organizations to achieve productive and sustainable use of natural resources on which all life and human activity depend. The Institute endeavours for excellence in environmental science, technology and management by working hand-in-hand with its partners to protect environmental health and ecosystem integrity in India, and around the world, through need-based education, training and research programmes.

Since its foundation, SIES IIEM has been an active proponent of knowledge-based research and development to address upstream concerns on conservation of natural resources and protection of environment. With immense prescience, IIEM took up challenging issues in the areas of Corporate Green Accounting Procedures; Market Based Instruments for Regional Environmental Management, Minimization of Environment & Resource Impacts, Consequence Analysis of Eco-system Health with Recourse to Hybrid Multi-layered Neural Network etc. These research projects were supported with funding from IGIDR, Mumbai, MoEF, GEC and Wetlands International South Asia & Loktak Development Authority.

While the initial research projects were primarily in the area of Environment Management, SIES IIEM rapidly evolved and today its structure also comprises the human resource skills

and infrastructure to facilitate contemporary research in Biotechnology. The Government funded research projects handled by the Institute over the last five years in these areas include Climate change adaptation of onion crop, Monitoring and GIS mapping of water quality in urban slums of Greater Mumbai, Electrochemical oxidation of non-incinerable hazardous waste etc. These research projects have obtained financial support from DST, New Delhi and BRNS, Mumbai. The useful research work in the above areas has resulted in transfer technology to society and publishing many research papers. In last five years, the Institute has supported the Maharashtra Pollution Control Board and different industries by supporting in consultancy projects viz. Biomonitoring and indexing of 56 rivers of Maharashtra at 156 National Water Quality Monitoring Stations in Maharashtra, Seed ball propagation for developing green cover in Maharashtra, Development of biofertilizer lab and novel culture of AM fungi for Agri search India Ltd., Treatment of leachate of hazardous waste.

It is affiliated to the University of Mumbai and approved as a Research institution. It offers Masters and Doctoral programmes in Environment Management and Post Graduate Diploma in Sustainable Environment Management. It also offers several certificate programmes.

12. SIES Institute of Medical and Laboratory Technology (SIES IMLT)

It was established in 1983 at the Sion (West) premises. It is recognised by Maharashtra State Board for Technical Examinations (MSBTE). About 40 – 50 students are enrolled each year. Upon successful completion of the course, they are placed in private and civil hospitals.

13. SIES School of Pharmaceutical Sciences, Shirvane, Navi Mumbai.

This School has been constructed on a separate plot of land D-125 in MIDC, Shirvane, Navi Mumbai. The plot area 2285 sqm² and the total construction is 61467 sq.ft. This School has commenced its activities from the Academic Year 2023-24 offering both Diploma and Undergraduate Degree programmes in Pharmacy and after the first batch of degree students pass out commence the Master's Programme in Pharmacy. It is also proposed to add newer degrees in clinical sciences, Pharmaceutical regulatory framework worldwide and sandwiched programmes on patents and trademarks in the area of Pharmaceuticals. The School is affiliated to the University of Mumbai and once the proposed SIES University takes shape, shall be brought within its affiliation. The programs are approved by the AICTE.

14. SIES School of Law[Proposed]

The Society had applied for the School of Law in 2017 to the Government of Maharashtra after the University of Mumbai had given its recommendation to the State Government for starting this School. The Government did not give its approval with the result a Writ Petition was filed in the Hon'ble Bombay High Court, but the same did not translate into a successful completion.

It is proposed to introduce the 3-year Law Course, a 6-semester full time course from 2027-28 leading to LLB Degree. For students completing upto 4th Semester and not wishing to pursue their education further, they would be given the LLB (General Degree) which would not give them the right to practice as Advocates. The 5-year Law Course leading to B.Sc. (LLB), B. A. (LLB), B. Com (LLB) is an integrated 10 semester law course after the 12th Standard. After the first batch of graduates passed out, master's programme in law will be introduced. It is also

proposed to offer various degrees and diploma programmes in several specialised legal studies in later years.

15. SIES College of Education [Proposed], Sion [West] and [Nerul]

The Society presently has the SIES Institute of Comprehensive Education which is an umbrella institution with courses in Teacher Education, Counselling and Special Education. The Institute has just completed over 40 years of its service in the field of teacher education. It runs the DECCEd programmes affiliated to the University of Mumbai. The counselling programmes include 1 year post graduate diploma in counselling (PGDC) affiliated to the University of Mumbai and 1 year post graduate diploma in Guidance and Counselling (PGDGC). It also offers short term programmes in Counselling both basic and advance. The Post Graduate Diploma in Special Education has been successfully run for over a decade. The Institute received the NCERT award for innovation in Pre-School “Shishu Pahel Model”.

It is proposed to upgrade this institute into a Degree College for both B.Ed and D.Ed in General Education, Rehabilitation and Special Education, Diploma programmes would also be part of offerings from the proposed college. This college will function from Nerul campus and the campus of SIES College of Arts, Science & Commerce (Empowered Autonomous).

16. SIES School of Physiotherapy [Proposed]

It is proposed to commence this School from 2026-27, at the Nerul campus of the Society. SIES has applied to the Government of Maharashtra seeking permission to start the School. The School will be initially affiliated with the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik and would come within the proposed SIES University after its formation. It is proposed to offer degree in Physiotherapy initially with an intake of 80 students and in later years Masters in Physiotherapy. The Society has received a NOC from NMMC for practical experience of their students at the NMMC -run hospitals

17. SIES School of Nursing [Proposed]

SIES School of Nursing is proposed to commence at the Nerul campus of the Society from the academic year 2027-28 and SIES has applied to the Government of Maharashtra for permission to start the programs The School will offer the following courses :

- B.Sc. (Nursing) – 4 years.
- M.Sc. (Nursing) – 2 years
- Post basic (B.Sc.) (N) – 2 years
- General Nursing and mid-wifery (GNM) – 3 years

The school is attached to Zen Hospital, Chembur, Mumbai and has received a NOC from NMMC for practical experience of their students at the NMMC -run hospitals. . This parent hospital institution shall give the required exposure to hospital management for the students.

18. SIES School of Fine Arts [Proposed]

SIES has a rich tradition of turning out several musicians from its students as front ranking national award musicians with an exceptional record of achievement. There could be no other institution that could have generated such a galaxy of musicians from its ranks. They include

- Padma Bhushan Smt. Shreya Ghoshal, National Awardee
- Padmashri Dr. Aruna Sairam, former Vice-Chairman of Central Sangeet Natak Akademi

- Shri. Naresh Iyer, National Awardee
- Shri. Ghanshyam Vaswani, Ghazal maestro and music director

SIES School of Fine Arts will begin formal coaching in light music. After a year, classical music will be introduced, both in Hindustani and Carnatic music with Degree and Diploma programmes. Facilities for percussion training include that for Mridangam, Tabla and Pakhawaj. In later years, Violin, Sitar and Sarod would also be brought within the streams of study. Western classical would be progressively introduced.

As a first step, a minimum 12 session credit (3 months) in appreciation in music of any genre would be made compulsory for any graduate degree offered by the proposed University. This would be in addition to the formal degree and diploma programmes. Certificate for appreciation in music would be given to every graduate student of the University.

19. SIES School of Foreign Languages[Proposed]

It is proposed to set up the SIES School of Foreign Languages immediately after the establishment of the University offering short term conversational courses in

Spanish
Mandarin
German
French
Japanese

These would be of 3 months duration and would be conducted jointly in alliance with Consulates of the various countries with these languages. Every student graduating from the University will have to go through a compulsory 12 session credit (3 months) for conversational proficiency in any one of these languages.

The Society has entered into academic collaboration agreement with Osaka State University, Japan dated 26th September 2019. This university has now become a mega university of Government institutions of Japan called Osaka Metropolitan University. Under the

collaboration, it is proposed to offer several graduate programmes in high end technical education particularly in Mechanical, Robotics, Signals, Geo Informatics. In later years with foray into Architecture and Landscape, SIES will explore Building Engineering, Urban Planning and Design with the Osaka Metropolitan University. The 9G technologies trend that defined the future would be brought within the academic collaboration. The academic collaboration could not be implemented between 2019 to 2023 in view of the pandemic. The MoU would be implemented under the proposed Deemed to be University.

20. SIES Incubation Centre

This centre is set up and backed by IIMA Ventures, sponsored by Indian Institute of Management, Amdavad [IIM-A].. It is the best-in-class incubation centre, backing entrepreneurs, building disruptive solutions in consequential sectors. The SIES Incubation Centre would also be supported by the Department of Science & Technology, Government of India. The spectrum of activities covered by the SIES Incubation Centre is divided into four verticals. The SIES Incubation Centre is a sector-agnostic incubator, welcoming start -ups across a wide range of industries, but has a primary focus on high impact sectors that address the critical needs of the future. The Sectors include Deep Tech, Edu Tech, Biotechnology & Pharma, ESG & Sustainable Packaging and Media & Entertainment.

- a) Connect- for ecosystem Meetups, Mentoring and Angel Training, Networking Meetups, Panel discussions, Experience sharing between investors, Founders, Start-up Enthusiasts, etc. Connect has done 12 Boosters, 80 Start-ups, 3 Bootcamps, 60 Teams.
- b) Learn - for short duration knowledge dissemination sessions to provide structured support InnoCity has done 4 Programs, 40 Start-ups, 25% successful Start-ups
- c) Booster - for identifying problems faced by early-stage Start-ups, specifically at prototype, feedback to early-stage founders regarding the business idea and way forward.
- d) Pitch- for curating investment ready start-ups, provide 'focused evaluation visibility 'with Angels/HNIs to kick start first-round fundraise InnoCity Pitch has done 8 Pitches, 40 Start-ups.

All the above institutions except the Schools will come under the proposed SIES Deemed to be University.

Social Institutions

1. SIES Sri Chandrasekarendra Saraswathi Veda Vidya Pitha

The SIES Sri. Chandrasekarendra Saraswathi Veda Vidya Pitha embraces the traditional Gurukula system of learning with modern education. It combines vedic learning with mainstream education. The Veda Vidyarthi enrolled in the Vidya Pitha study at the State Bank of India Officers Association School for regular 10+2 education. Vedic studies are imparted in a traditional environment. The inmates of the home double up as Honorary Teachers for these students teaching them English, Mathematics, Sciences etc. that form part of School education. A therapeutic union that provides the company of the elders for students moved out of their homes for learning and yearning for parents and the elderly who long for children, either having moved away from them or childless. This bond has emerged as a potent social initiative.

The present education system has been inadequate for the task of turning out sufficient young leaders who can lift the country out of the polluted waters of our public life and the slime and sledge of a corrupted economy. The aim of character based higher education must be to leave a residuum called culture which would teach a meaningful philosophy of life and enriched character. The traditional Gurukula system has several inherent advantages and promotes a Guru Shishya relationship that transcends all material barriers. In living with our times of integration of old values with modern day means to forge healthy and durable teaching methods that would ultimately lead to good citizens, SIES Sri. Chandrasekarendra Saraswathi Veda Vidya Pitha was inaugurated. In this unique education model, children have the best of both the systems of education. The entire cost of boarding, lodging, education, healthcare and other needs of the Veda Vidyarthi is borne by the Society, and no contribution is received from the students.

The system has already seen the emergence of doctors, post graduates, Graduates who are conversant with Indian culture, tradition and art. The track record of the students who have passed out of the system bears ample testimony to the success of the dual education system. By far this is the most significant innovation brought about by the Society during its long history of nine decades.

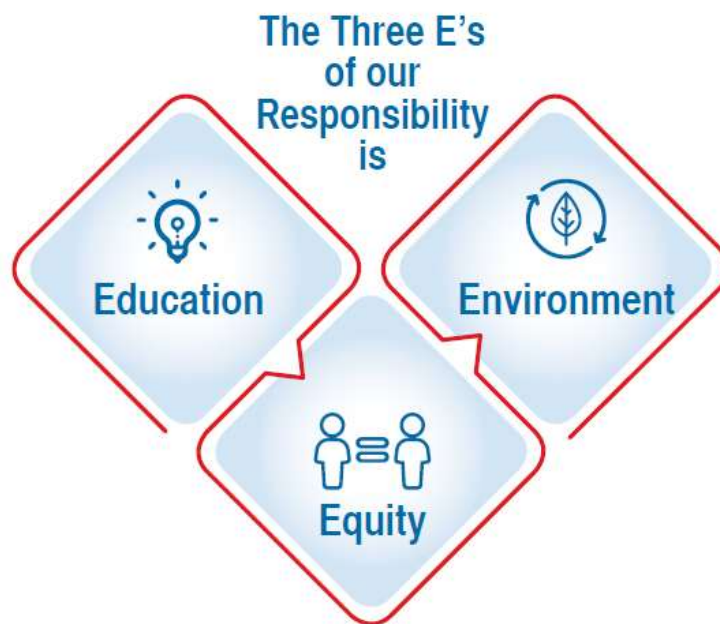
Since the students study in a dual education system, they are sent to SBOA Public School, Nerul for regular education for which the fees is paid by the Society. During the last 10 years, the Society incurred a deficit of Rs. 3.73 crores on the dual education of these students.

2. SIES Seniors Home (Care of the Elderly)

This home was inaugurated on 27th December 2002. Unlike the conventional home for the elderly, this is a unique social initiative mainly for the teachers of yesteryears who survive on a meagre pay and the terminal benefits received on superannuation were too little to lend dignity to their residual life. The home provides free boarding and lodging for teachers who cannot afford any contribution, limited to boarding charges for teachers who receive nominal pension / interest on their savings. The home is designed for disabled friendly. In the last ten years, the Society incurred a net deficit of Rs. 2.25 crores for running this home. The inmates

also double up as teachers for the students of SIES Sri Chandrasekarendra Saraswathi Veda Vidya Pitha with special coaching for English, Mathematics and Languages. The home was relocated to a more spacious ‘Kamakshi Nilayam’ in the Nerul Campus built at a cost of Rs 15 crores.

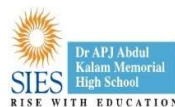
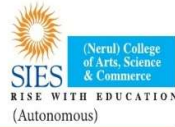

- The Indian Knowledge System (IKS) Centre was established and inaugurated as per the requirement of NEP 2020 at the hands of noted parliamentarian, Dr Vinay Sahasrabudhhe, Chairman, State Cultural Policy Implementation Committee on 24th November 2025.
- The ISR team with NSS and NCC units of the College conducted a stationery collection and distribution drive as part of Marathwada Flood Relief measures for the students of Shri Sant Gajanan Mahavidyalaya, Kharda, Maharashtra under the aegis of the Director, Higher Education, Government of Maharashtra on 16th and 17th October 2025. The college was honoured by the Department of Higher and Technical Education, Pune, for this noble act during a ceremony held at Modern College of Arts, Science and Commerce (Autonomous), Pune on 19th November 2025.
- The Department of Philosophy, SIES College of Arts, Science and Commerce [Empowered Autonomous] coordinated a Refresher Course in Indian Knowledge System organised by the University Grants Commission Matkalaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (UGC-MMTTC), University of Mumbai from 8th to 20th September 2025.

Indian Knowledge Centre

The College inaugurated its 'Indian Knowledge System Centre' on 24th November 2025. The program began with the lighting of the lamp and Saraswati Vandana. The chief guest, Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe, noted parliamentarian and Chairman, State Cultural Policy Implementation Committee inaugurated the Indian Knowledge Tradition Centre and addressed the faculty and students. Speaking on the topic "Indian Knowledge Tradition as a Soft Power in Global Context", he said that Indian knowledge tradition is a universal life vision, a heritage of the entire world. Dr Sahasrabuddhe expressed his happiness about the establishment of the Indian Knowledge System Center in the college, saying that it will significantly contribute to the holistic development of students.

On this occasion, Dr. Uma Shankar, Director [Academics] of SIES ., honoured Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe with an angavastra, memento, Rudraksha mala, and bouquet. Dr. Satish Sarfare, I/C Principal, gave the welcome speech. Dr. Dinesh Pathak, Nodal Officer of the Indian Knowledge Tradition Centre, introduced the guest. The program was conducted by Miss Snehal Unde, and the vote of thanks was given by Coordinator Dr. V. Vishnu Prasad. A large number of students and faculty members were present on this occasion.

A **one-day National Seminar** on the topic "Indian Knowledge Tradition: Diverse Perspectives and Relevance" was organized under the joint aegis of the **Department of Hindi, Centre for Indian Knowledge System and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)** of the college with sponsorship from India Exim Bank on 27th February 2026.

Seminars, Conferences, Workshops, Refresher Courses

SIES College of Arts, Science and Commerce [Empowered Autonomous] coordinated a **Refresher Course in Indian Knowledge System** organised by the University Grants Commission Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (UGC-MMTTC), University of Mumbai. The two-week online Refresher Course titled "Teaching India: Empowering Educators with IKS," ran from September 8 to 20, 2025 and was coordinated by Dr Kamala Srinivas, Head, **Department of Philosophy**. It trained 34 faculty members from diverse fields like science, humanities, commerce, management studies and performing arts.

Course Structure and Themes: The program featured daily Zoom sessions from 10:00 a.m. to 5:10 p.m., with four sessions per day, including expert lectures, MCQs, assignments, and seminars. Week 1 covered foundations such as the Vedic corpus, the Darshana Shastra, the Puranas, the Itihasa, the Shastras, ancient science (astronomy and mathematics), the Gurukula systems, Ayurveda, archaeo-metallurgy, and regional literature from North and South India.

Week 2 delved into holistic systems such as Natyashastra, musicology, yoga, mental health, environmental ethics, governance, Indology, and curriculum design. Interactive elements included virtual heritage visits, group seminars where participants presented IKS-integrated curricula, and final evaluations via MCQs and feedback sessions were conducted.

The event was inaugurated by Dr Satish Sarfare, in-charge Principal, SIES College of Arts, Science and Commerce [Empowered Autonomous] speech delivered by Dr Uma Shankar, Director of Academics, SIES. Sessions featured experts like Dr Radhakrishnan Pillai on strategic governance, Dr Pushya Gautama on Natyashastra, and Dr S. Panneerselvam in the valedictory address on philosophical methods. Topics highlighted the importance of IKS in NEP 2020, emphasizing sustainable living, interdisciplinary learning, and empathy.

Participants actively engaged, introduced speakers, expressed thanks, and led presentations. Highlights included reclaiming mathematical heritage, Jyotisha astronomy, botanical knowledge, and storytelling in commerce. All 34 participants completed the course, gaining tools to integrate IKS into modern curricula for holistic education. Feedback praised the immersive experience, bridging ancient wisdom with contemporary challenges. Coordinator Dr Kamala Srinivas thanked UGC-MMTTC Director Dr Vidya Vencatesan, resource persons, evaluators, and the organizing team, including Ms Vrushali Gupte, Ms Moushmi Prasad, Ms Akansha Parimalan and Mr Nachiket Kurhe. This initiative fostered rediscovery of India's civilizational knowledge, equipping educators to cultivate well-rounded individuals.

The **Department of Biotechnology** organized a three-day Teacher Training Workshop titled "*Integrating Indian Knowledge Systems with Omics and Computational Biology in Teacher Education*" from 22nd to 24th January 2026 for 23 teachers across various biological sciences,

representing colleges across Mumbai. Sponsored by the Lady Tata Memorial Trust, the workshop aimed to strengthen interdisciplinary teacher education by integrating Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) with modern omics and computational biology in alignment with the National Education Policy 2020.

The programme began with an inaugural session highlighting the importance of integrating traditional Indian knowledge with contemporary scientific education. Various eminent speakers from reputed academic and research institutions delivered expert lectures emphasizing the relevance of IKS in modern biological sciences. The keynote session underscored the role of natural products and traditional knowledge in research and education.

Technical sessions addressed foundational concepts of IKS, particularly Ayurveda, and their integration with interdisciplinary areas such as Ayurgenomics and natural product research. Hands-on laboratory sessions provided participants with practical exposure to phytochemical extraction techniques and analytical methods, thereby enhancing experiential learning. Subsequent sessions focused on bioactive compound discovery, antimicrobial resistance, and the application of computational and bioinformatics tools in bioscience research. Teacher participants were introduced to Next-Generation Sequencing concepts, genomic databases, network polypharmacology, molecular docking, and protein-protein interaction analysis through guided demonstrations.

The workshop concluded with discussions on translating traditional medicinal knowledge into omics-based research and promoting sustainable and holistic practices rooted in IKS. Overall, the workshop successfully combined expert lectures, practical training, and interdisciplinary discussions, enriching participants' pedagogical perspectives.

The **Department of Commerce** organised a Seminar on Financial Literacy for Girls in association with Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on 20th January 2026.

The **Department of Computer Science** organised a seminar overseas education and career opportunities for SIES graduates, on 21st August 2025.

The **Department of Computer Science** organised a Workshop on Digital Productivity with AI on 22nd January 2026.

The **Departments of Economics, Philosophy and Politics** of the College, in association with Dr. Bhanuben Mahendra Nanavati College of Home Science (Empowered Autonomous), organised a RUSA sponsored Two-days Interdisciplinary National Conference on "Women Led Development: Perspectives and Prospects" on 28th and 29th November 2025.

The national conference aimed to critically examine the concept of Women-Led Development (WLD), share research findings, and encourage dialogue on inclusive strategies for gender-responsive growth. The event brought together academicians, entrepreneurs, legal experts, and grassroots leaders to deliberate on women's contributions and challenges across education, entrepreneurship, climate justice, and governance.

Prof. Mala Pandurang, Principal of BMN College, opened the conference by emphasizing that women often serve as "quiet yet effective leaders," navigating systemic obstacles to achieve success. Dr. Satish Sarfare, I/C Principal of SIES College, highlighted the importance of academic-collaboration and expressed hope that the conference would generate inclusive

perspectives. Dr. Rashmi Bhure (Co-ordinator of the Conference) outlined the thematic focus on empowerment, equity, and leadership.

Prof. Ritu Dewan, former Director, Department of Economics, University of Mumbai delivered a powerful keynote, arguing that women-led development is not about token inclusion but about structural transformation. Prof. Dewan called for gender-responsive budgeting and intersectional approaches. The Panel Discussion on “Women-led Development & Financial Inclusion” included speakers like Mrs Meenal Mohadikar, Ms Sanjita Prasad, Founder, Amaltas Inc., Ms Aditi Limaye Kamat, a prominent hotelier and was moderated by Ms Mithila Naik-Satam. The conference was graced by speakers like Ms Ami Ganatra, Ms Reema Nanavaty, Justice (Retd.) K. R. Shriram, formerly Chief Justice of the Madras and Rajasthan High Courts, Dr. Padma V. Devrajan, Prof. G. Mythili, Dr. Meera Baindur. The Valedictory Address was delivered by Chetana Gala Sinha. Dr. Shruti Panday (Joint Coordinator of the Conference) delivered the vote of thanks and expressed gratitude to RUSA, collaborating institutions, organizing departments, volunteers, and participants for their valuable contributions.

The **Department of English** organised a workshop on “The Art of Fiction Writing” Workshop on 10th December 2025. The resource person for the workshop was Asha Thanki, the recipient of the 2025 Balcones Prize and 2024 Best Book of the Year by NPR and The Boston Globe for her novel *A Thousand Times Before*. Ms Thanki prefaced the workshop by sharing a brief overview of her writing journey, influences and stylistic approaches. The session progressed through interactive discussions and writing exercises that gave students an insight into the foundations of creative expression. She delved into the nature of fiction, its various forms and the role of labels and genres in shaping the perception of a work. She highlighted stories as a powerful medium of political commentary, covering the use of “political fiction” as a redundant term. A key segment of the workshop focused on the use of temporal placement in fiction, employing the lens of the classic plot structure to create narrative progression and weight. Ms Thanki encouraged students to think critically about the environment, texture and tone of the works they consume to deepen their understanding of the complexity behind seemingly straightforward stories. The session concluded with a Q&A segment, where the author addressed questions on creativity, writer’s block, character development and literary influence with insightful answers. The event introduced students to the process behind fiction writing, the cultivation of creative skills and a deeper perspective into the world of narrative techniques.

The **Department of Environmental Science** conducted a one-day hands-on workshop and Mock Drill on Emergency Preparedness for staff and students in collaboration with the Science Association on December 11, 2025.

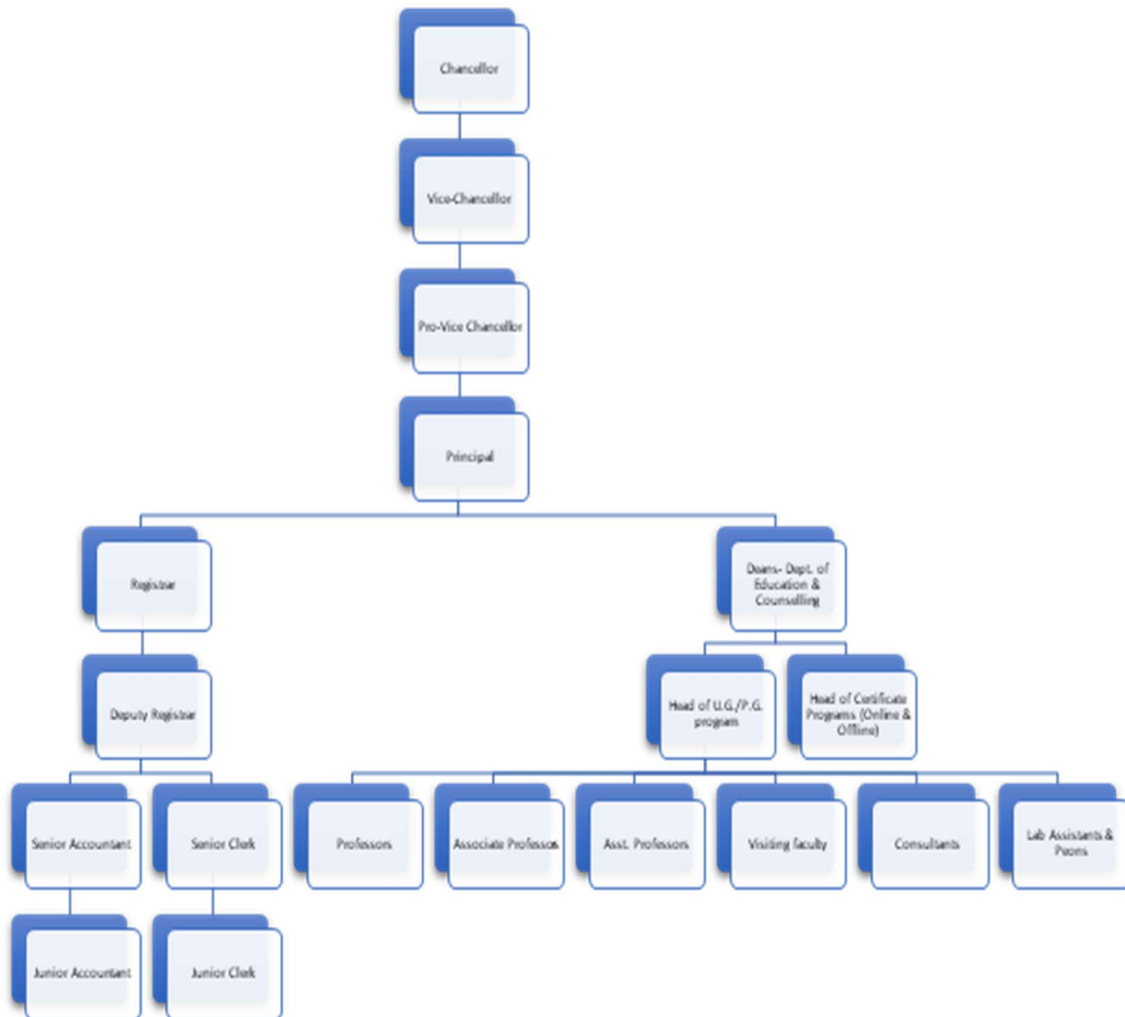
Nerul/Matunga campus requirements

Research Plan

Research at SIES Institute of Comprehensive Education is carried out in two ways – one by the faculty of the institute and the other by the students. - b) All the above Agreement to Lease shall be hereinafter cumulatively referred to as "**principal Agreement.**"

- c) All the above plots were amalgamated into 1 plot admeasuring 24,795.64 sqms. These 03 plots were amalgamated with the total area being 24,795.64 sqms vide letter dated 17.12.2003, hereinafter referred to as the "Said Land".

- d) Vide application, dated 08.11.2008, the Licensee requested the Corporation to grant additional permissible FSI 1.0 for the entire amalgamated plot of land on the "Said Land." - III. The necessary infrastructure for electric supply shall be provided within the Said Land as per the requirement of MSEDCL, including the sub-station, if found necessary.
- IV. The Licensee shall provide lay-bye as per the provisions made in the NMMC Development Control Regulations for Navi Mumbai, 1975.
- V. "That the Senate approve of the report of the Syndicate in the matter of the permanent affiliation of the South Indian Education Society's College of Arts and Science, Bombay, and record their opinion that the affiliation of the college to the University, for the teaching of the courses of study leading to the B.A. (General and Special) degree examination in English, Marathi, Gujarati, Hindi, Economics, Politics, Philosophy and Mathematics; the B.A. (General) degree examination in Sanskrit, French, German and History; the Intermediate Science examination with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics and Physics, Chemistry and Biology and the B.Sc. degree examination in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics (Principal and Subsidiary) and Botany and Zoology (Subsidiary) be made permanent with effect from 20th June, 1969."

The motion was put to the vote and carried.

We are enclosing herewith the audited Balance Sheet of the Society as of 31st March 2025. As could be seen, we had fixed deposits / Government securities of Rs. 564.75 crores and bank balance of Rs. 62.44 crores. As on 31st March 2026, we had deposits of Rs. 636.96 crores and flexi deposit of Rs. 35 crores. This extent of solvency is far more than the requirement of the proposed university.
