
DAKSHINAYANAM

The refund of fees as applicable shall be made by NEFT transfer to parent's SB Account only thereafter. The percentage of fees for the programme shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows.

- All the fee items chargeable are as per relevant University circulars for different faculties (Excluding the programmes for which the total amount is ixed by other competent authorities).
- 2. The fees charged towards group insurance and all fee components to be

paid as University share (including Vice– Chancellor's fund, University fee for sports and cultural activities, E-charge, disaster management fund, examination fee, N.S.S. cell fund and enrolment fee) are nonrefundable if payment is made by college prior to the date of cancellation.

3. All refundable deposits (Laboratory, caution money, library, etc.) shall be fully returned at the time of cancellation after deducting liability if any.

ATTENDANCE AND GRANT OF TERMS For Post-Graduate degree programmes (Reference No.: UG/253 of 1996) 0.3574

- 1. The registration fee once paid for the postgraduate programme will not refunded for any reason.
- 2. The tuition fee paid by a candidate for the programme in which he / she is registered as a post-graduate learner will be refunded to him / her if he / she leaves the said programme without attending any lectures, seminars or practicals, subject to a deduction of 20% of tuition fee there from the administrative charges. An application by the candidate for such refund will only be entertained if it is received by the Principal within ifteen davs from the date of commencement of the lectures of the semester in which the fee is paid.
- 3. The tuition fee paid by the candidate for the programme in which he / she is registered as a post-graduate learner will be refunded to him / her if he / she leaves the said programme and joins another programme of this University for which he / she applied at the same time and the selection for the new programme of this University is made later, subject to deduction of 20% of the tuition fee there from for the administrative charges. An application is entertained if it is received by the Principal within

ifteen days from the date of his / her paying tuition fee for the be new programme.

A. ORDINANCES 0.119, 0.120

explanation issued The bv the university wide circular no. UD / 235 / 98 dated July 3, 1998 relating to 0.119 says that - 'for granting of terms of 75% of theory, practical and tutorials (wherever prescribed) separately will be required, out of the total number of lectures. practicals and tutorials conducted in the term.

B. ORDINANCE 0.125

- 1. It states that 'To keep a term at a college or recognized institution. learner must complete to the satisfaction of the Principal or the Head of Institution, the course of study at the college or institution prescribed for such terms for the class to which such learner then belong's.
- 2. Learners who fail to maintain the condition of minimum attendance on account of illness, or any other reason which is deemed right by the

Principal, should apply in writing to the Principal, for leave of absence, prior or within two days from the date of commencement of such leave, failing which they will be treated as defaulters.

3. All applications for leave of absence along with medical certilcate, if any, should be submitted to the Principal and not directly to any teacher.



GENERAL RULES PERTAINING TO ATTENDANCE

- Learners who request leave of absence from lectures practicals

For smooth conduct of academic and administrative activities, students and

parents are requested to cooperate

and follow the instructions/rules and regulations of the University of Mumbai and the college which are as follows:

All admission procedures and fee structure 4. will be as per the guidelines of the University of Mumbai.

- Admissions are provisional until all the necessary documents (like Original Mark sheets, attested copy of Mark sheets, Original Leaving Certificate, attested copy of Leaving Certificate, Eligibility and Transfer Certificate (wherever applicable), ABC/APAAR ID photographs etc. are submitted to the college office, verified and endorsed.
- For FY B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. the students must complete the Enrollment procedure for the conformation of their admission.
- On securing admission every student shall obtain an Identity card and a Library Card. No student shall be permitted to enter the college premises without a valid Identity card. Every student should wear his/her

Identity Card while being present in the college premises.

- Cancellation of admissions will be done as per the norms of the University of Mumbai.
- Refund of fees for the Degree College shall be as per rules of the University of Mumbai.
 - For the cancellation of admissions and refund of fees, the Identity Card, the Library Readers' Cards (if issued) and the Fee Receipt shall be surrendered to the college office along with the application of refund.
 - 7. Caution Money and Library Deposit will be refunded (if not forfeited for any reason) to a student when he/she ceases to be a student of the college, provided it is certified that he/she owes no money to the college. He/she has no library books or any other college property in his / her possession.

- The Caution Money and Library Deposit will be refunded only on the dates notified by the college. A prescribed form for the refund of fees is available in the college office.
- Those requiring certificates, recommendations or testimonials with reference to their performance, progress and participation in a subject or activity should apply to the concerned Head of the Department or the Coordinator in-charge.

EXAMINATIONS AND EVALUATION

1. Examination will be conducted as per credit base system for all courses Under this scheme, in each semester, students will be evaluated through internal assessment, consisting of class tests, assignments and projects and semester and examination. For Regular Degree Courses there will be two Semester End Examinations per year. It is compulsory for every student to be present for internal evaluation and Semester End examination as per the schedule announced in each Semester.

- The standard of passing, rules of gracing and the benefits of ATKT (i.e. Allowed To Keep Terms) will be as per the rules the College.
- Verification/Revaluation of answer books is provided as per the rules of the College.
- The details regarding schedule of Examinations, Results, Verification and Revaluation will be displayed on the College Notice Boards from time to time.
- Eligibility for promotion to higher class will be as per the College policy.

USE OF UNFAIR MEANS

A student found to have used Unfair Means in the examination will be dealt with as per the provisions laid down by the College.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- The conduct of students in the college shall be such that it will not interfere with the orderly administration and discipline in the college, or cause any disturbances to fellow students.
- 2. Students are expected to come to the college decently attired.



- Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in and around the campus and is punishable under law as per the Supreme Court decision.

Ragging is strictly prohibited in the College premises and outside.


