FOR UNDER GRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMMES

(Reference No.:/412 of 2008)0.2859 Refund of Tution, Development and all other fees after cancellation of Admission The candidates who have taken admission in under graduate programmes may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the programme. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made by NEFT transfer to parent's SB Account only thereafter. The percentage of fees for the programme shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows.

Note: The total amount considered for the refund of fees from the commencement of academic term of the programmes includes the following-

- All the fee items chargeable are as per relevant University circulars for different faculties (Excluding the programmes for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities).
- University share of group insurance, Vice-Chancellor's fund, University fee for sports and cultural activities, E-charge, disaster management fund, examination fee, N.S.S. cell fund and enrolment fee are non- refundable if payment is made by college prior to the date of cancellation.
- All refundable deposits (Laboratory, caution money, library, etc.) shall be fully returned at the time of cancellation after deducting liability if any.

EXAMINATIONS & EVALUATION

FOR UG & PG COURSES

Comprehensive Continuous Evaluation (CCE) and Semester End Examination (SEE).

1. Examination will be conducted as per credit base system for all courses. Under this scheme, in each semester, students will be evaluated through internal assessment consisting of class tests, assignments and projects and semester and examination.
2. For Regular Degree Courses there will be two Semester End Examinations per year. It is compulsory for every student to be present for internal evaluation and Semester End examination as per the schedule announced in each Semester.
3. The standard of passing, rules of gracing and the benefits of ATKT (i.e. Allowed To Keep Terms) will be as per the rules of the College.
4. Verification/Revaluation of answer books is provided as per the rules of the College. The details regarding schedule of Examinations, Results, Verification and Revaluation will be displayed on the College Notice Boards from time to time.
5. Eligibility for promotion to higher class will be as per the College policy.
