


- 1. **Objectives:** To check the level of satisfaction of the students about Teaching Learning, Learning Resources, Infrastructure, Co Curricular and Extra Curricular activities.
- 2. **Number of respondents:** 1,419 (Approximately 30% students)
- 3. **Dates:** 15/04/2021 17/04/2021
- 4. **Methodology:** Structured feedback form(Google form) was shared with students of all streams, selected randomly. The form contained structured questions about curriculum, teaching-learning, evaluation, co-curricular activities, and infrastructure. The last question was open ended inviting suggestions from students.



Out of 1419 students, 1209 students are from bachelor's degree, 178 students are from master's degree, 12 students are from UG diploma, 16 students are from PG diploma, and 4 are from Ph.D.

Out of 1419 students, 1086 students say that they will recommend this institute to others, 76.53%. Out of 1086 students, 1006 students say their overall experience in college is good and excellent, which is 92.63%. Out of 1419 students, 333 students say that they may recommend this institute to others.



The Questions and analysis of responses is shown below graphically:


Each question is rated on a scale of 1 to 5. 1 being lowest rated and 5 being highest rated

- 3. How would you rate your classroom teaching-learning experience in stimulating your interest in the subject/s?








