

#### REPORT ON STUDENTS' FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM FOR 2023--24

**Objective:** To obtain feedback of students on curriculum, teaching-learning and evaluation and to utilize the same for upgradation of syllabus.

**Methodology:** Feedback on the curriculum was sought from the learners using Google forms. Structured – course wise feedback forms were shared with students, the responses were collected and analysed. The observations and conclusions were shared with teachers for appropriate actions required on their part. The conclusions were used for upgradation of syllabus of the First Year Courses after discussion with BOS of the respective subjects.

The analysis was submitted to the institution head for further action.

The departments have maintained the feedback analysis reports as a part of their records. Here is a sampling of some responses along with the action taken on the same:

1.	Students suggested the need for more workshops and seminars that would provide them with guidance to choose their career paths and give more clarity on various career opportunities. Students also requested that subjects like Mutual fund should be made more interesting with the help of examples. 2.	Forty percent of the First Year BA English Literature students found the material in the library inadequate. A majority found it moderately adequate. 16.4% of the Third Year BA students found the material in the library inadequate.	Additional materials in the form of e-content was provided to the students so that they had enough reference material to prepare for their exams. Recommendations were given by First Year BAMMC students with respect to conducting industry-oriented guest sessions, releasing study material in advance, OE subject change permissions and making adjustments to the syllabus to make it less vast and easier to understand. In addition they requested that Film and Photography related courses and assignments should be given and that the Electronic Media course syllabus be revised. Industry expert lectures within the scope of the syllabus were consulted for revising the syllabi accordingly. It was decided that the Electronic Media course would be revised and OE subject change request was communicated to the higher authorities.









Q7 If employed/self employed, how helpful has the graduation been to your job?

Q8 If pursuing higher education, how helpful has the knowledge gained through graduation been to your studies?




Q9 Rate the teaching and content delivery at SIES in comparison with the institute where you are pursuing higher studies

## ACTION TAKEN REPORT AFTER ANALYSIS OF THE ALUMNI FEEDBACK TAKEN (2023-24)

It was noticed that the alumni of the following four departments had NOT responded to the feedback form namely, Information Technology (IT), Physics, Mathematics and Statistics.

This information along with a detailed analysis of each of the 11 questions was provided to the Principal who in turn, discussed the issue with the concerned Heads of Departments for necessary action during the next academic year. The detailed question wise overview presented to the Principal was as follows:

### Q.1. Overall content of the course:

90% of our alumni found the overall content of the courses to be excellent and good;

9% of the alumni found it to be average and 1% found it to be inadequate.

The two departments whose alumni found the overall content to be inadequate were Biotechnology and Botany.

#### Q.2. Manner in which the course was conducted:

85% of the alumni found it to be excellent and good; 11% found it to be average and 3% found it to be inadequate.

The alumni from the following departments found the manner in which the courses were conducted to be INADEQUATE: BMS, BSc. Chemistry, BA Economics, BSc. Computer Science, MSC Data Science, BSc. Biotechnology and MSc. Botany.

- Q.3. Motivation to pursue higher studies provided by faculty was found to be excellent and good by 84% of our alumni for 2023-24, average by 11% and inadequate by 5%.
- Q.4. Infrastructural facilities in the college was found to be excellent and good by only 64% of our alumni in 2023-24, while 27% found them to be average.

8% of our alumni found the infrastructural facilities inadequate and these alumni belong to the following departments: MSc. Chemistry, BA English, MSc. Data Science, BMS CM, BSc. Zoology and Biochem (3 units), Bcom, BAMMC, BA Hindi, BA Economics, BSC Biotechnology, MSc Computer Science, BA Politics and BSc. Microbiology.

This matter was brought to the attention of the Principal who assured the IQAC that the matter would be taken up with the Management during the next year's CDC meeting.



Q.5. Opportunities for co-curricular and extra – curricular activities in college

74% of our alumni found them to be excellent and good; 21% found them to be average and 5% found these opportunities to be inadequate.

The IQAC felt that the feedback on this would definitely improve a couple of years after NEP implementation as NEP takes care of these very well by giving credit and recognizing such efforts and talents adequately.

Q.6. What are you pursuing after graduation?

Higher studies in the country 55%

Higher Studies Abroad 7%

Employed 27%

Self-employed 27%

Others (studying for competitive exams or home makers) 4%

The IQAC felt that the increased percentage of self-employed directly correlates with the encouragement offered by the Nirmitee Kendra which encourages entrepreneurial ventures with seed money.

Q.7. If employed or self-employed, how helpful has graduation been for your job?

24% found it very helpful, 39% found it helpful, 20% found it moderately helpful, 17% found it irrelevant and 32% did not respond to this question at all.

The takeaway for the IQAC's criteria 1 was that question 7 should be made mandatory in future by giving Not Applicable as an option instead of making the question a voluntary one. This was the learning from the responses to the feedback form.

Q.8. If pursuing higher studies then how helpful was your UG programme?

43% found it very helpful; 38% found it helpful, 13% found it moderately helpful, 6% found it irrelevant and 13% did not respond to the question at all.



The takeaway for the IQAC's criteria 1 was that question 8 should be made mandatory in future by giving Not Applicable as an option instead of making the question a voluntary one. This was the learning from the responses to the feedback form.

Q.9. Rate the teaching and content delivery in comparison to the institution where you are pursuing higher studies.

37% found it to be superior

55% found it to be on par and 8% found it to be inferior

Q. 10. Will you recommend SIES to your friends?

89% responded in the affirmative and 11% responded in the negative.

Q.11. As an alumnus, would you like to participate in the institution's co-curricular, extracurricular activities and infrastructural development?

75% of our alumni responded affirmatively and 25% responded in the negative.

This was communicated to the IQAC, the SIES PSA and the Principal.
