A Case study of National Education Policy 2020 implementation Process

Objective: To orient teachers and students about reformation in the education policy to be implemented from Academic year 2023-24.

Method: Guest talks/ Orientation program/ webinar based on NEP 2020

The National Education Policy (NEP) to be implemented in the institution from the year 2023-24 for the First Year UG Programmes across streams. Along with the Core Courses as Major and Minor Subjects, the students will get an opportunity to study interdisciplinary courses through :

Vocational Skill Course (VSC): Courses which are aimed at providing hands-on training, competencies, proficiency to students to enhance skill & employability.

Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): Courses which are aimed at imparting practical skills, nurturing soft skills etc., to enhance the employability of students.

Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): Courses which are aimed at enabling the students to acquire & demonstrate the core linguistic skills, achieve competency in Modern Indian Language (such as Marathi/Hindi among others) and in English Language.

A compulsory course in Communication Skills in English (AEC) to all students across streams at the First Year UG Level from 2023-24. In the second year a compulsory course in Hindi to be offered to UG programmes from 2024-25
